Cover More Kids	Premium Assistance	The Florida Healthy Kids program is a premium assistance program for families who are over-income for SCHIP. The premiums are considered reasonable, and the program has attracted large numbers of CYSHCN.	EE
Build Capacity	Managed Care Purchasing	The Title V program operates the Medicaid Capitated Plan as part of the state's Medicaid reform. It is currently a managed care plan for CYSHCN who are covered by Medicaid, SCHIP or Title V, that includes medical care, behavioral health care and a large care coordination program. It will soon be transitioning to risk-adjusted capitation.	
Build Capacity	Consumer Directed Care	Florida operates a consumer-directed long-term care waiver program that includes children with developmental disabilities. In some cases, children with DD who also have one of five specific secondary diagnoses may also participate. This program allows families to purchase their own long-term support services.
