Close Benefit Gaps	Medicaid Buy-In	The TEFRA program is a Medicaid buy-in program for privately insured children who meet SSI clinical criteria and require home health services to remain in their homes. Parental income is disregarded in determining eligibility; families pay an annual fee to purchase Medicaid benefits as a wrap-around to their private insurance.	EE
Build Capacity	Integrated Delivery Models	Family Service and Children's Mental Health Collaboratives blend Title IV-E and Medicaid funds at the local level to provide care coordination and wrap-around services to children in the foster care system and children with serious emotional disturbance.	
Build Capacity	Interagency Collaboration	Title V and Medicaid are collaborating to conduct a joint evaluation of the cost-effectiveness of their medical home initiatives.
