Cover More Kids	TEFRA Look -Alike	New Hampshire's Home Care Program provides a single pathway to Medicaid eligibility for children with a broad range of disabilities. Family income is disregarded for children who meet SSI criteria and need an institutional level of care, including ICF-MR. Established by state statute and not through a Medicaid waiver, this program serves 1300 CYSHCN.	EE
Pay for Added Services	Care Coordination	The Partners in Chronic Care Program for New Hampshire CSHCN program provides a team approach to care, individual service planning, care coordination and family supports through primary care practices. Leadership comes from the Hood Center for Children and Families at Dartmouth Medical School and Title V. Reimbursement for enhanced care coordination comes from Anthem Blue Cross Blue Shield and Title V.	
Build Capacity	Outreach and Enrollment	The New Hampshire Medicaid program identifies CYSHCN by including questions about special needs on the Medicaid application form. If a family answers yes, the information is relayed to New Hampshire Family Voices (with the family's permission) for outreach independent of eligibility determination.
